

Credentials: Working press box credentials shall be issued only to accredited newspapers, magazines, radio and television reporters. Please make all requests for credentials in advance by phone or mail to the MSU Athletic Communications Office. Credentials can be mailed or picked up the night of the game at the Alltel Center box office located at the Hickory Street entrance.

Interviews: Head coach Troy Jutting is available in his office during the week in the morning. After games, he is available in his office at Alltel Center ten minutes after the game's end.





The Mavericks christened Alltel Center Feb. 3, 1995 when they defeated Alabama-Huntsville 6-3 in front of 3,147 fans.

The 1995-96 season marked MSU's first full season at the Center and the Mavericks responded by posting an 11-3-2 home record.

The Mavericks earned an all-time best 15 victories at the Center in 2002-03 and MSU's overall won-loss mark in the facility stands at 90-53-23 (.611).

An integral part of the Mavericks' move to NCAA Division I status, the arena seats 4,704.

In just a short time, Alltel Center has established itself as one of the Midwest's premiere centers for meetings and entertainment.

Alltel Center has hosted nationally televised events, such as the Riders Professional Ladies Figure Skating Championships, Monday Nitro World Championship Wrestling, professional indoor football, as well as collegiate, international and professional sporting events.

Alltel Center is made up of four components, including a 7,300-seat arena, a reception hall, conference center and a banquet/exhibition hall.

They also feature an in-house advertising agency as well as providing sales, catering and security staffing for all events.

<u>Arena</u>

State-of-the-art acoustics and a superb sound system make the Center arena one of the finest in the country.

With one of the largest floor capacities in Minnesota, the Arena has 7,300 seats available for concerts and has hosted some of the current popular national entertainment acts touring today.



Home Ice Advantage

Alltel Center (formerly known as Midwest Wireless Civic Center) serves as the home facility for the Minnesota State men's hockey program and the Mavericks have used the friendly confines of the downtown facility to their advantage. MSU's all-time mark in the Alltel Center stands at 108-65-29 (.606).

Local hockey fans have shown their appreciation for MSU's success at the Alltel Center by showing up in everincreasing numbers. The attendance in a game vs. North Dakota (2/22/03) of 5,182 established a single-game MSU record and, combined with the previous-night's crowd of 5,112, set a two-game series record of 10,294.

MSU's average attendance has increased five of the last six seasons

with 2003-04's 3,860 per game average representing an all-time high. MSU extended its own streak of top 25 attendance rankings to eight consecutive years after averaging 3,808 fans in 18 home contests to rank 21st in NCAA Division I last year. The average average attendance was the second-best figure in MSU history.

All Seasons Arena & The Don Brose Hockey Center



Opened in 1974, All Seasons Arena has served as the home of Minnesota State Hockey for more than 25 years.

With the completion of the MSU Hockey Complex addition (renamed The Don Brose Hockey Center in Oct. of 2000) to All Seasons Arena in the summer of 1999, the Mavericks can claim practice and administrative facilities second-to-none.

The facility is named after the former coach of MSU's men's hockey program, Don Brose. Brose, who led the Mavericks to a NCAA Division II title in 1980, completed his 30-year coaching career following the 1999-2000 season owning a 536-335-79 record.

Constructed to accommodate MSU's men's and women's hockey programs, All Seasons Arena features several amenities in making it one of the top college hockey administrative facilities in the nation.

With two different-sized ice sheets - one regulation and one Olympic, ASA gives the Mavericks unique flexibility.

The two-story 96,000-square foot Don Brose Hockey Center, completed in August of 1999, boasts student study center/lounge area equipped with computers, video equipment and a big screen television.

The complex also includes a reception area, athletic training room, equipment room, men's and women's hockey coaches offices, weight room and locker room areas.

MVBC's properties include KDOG (FM 96.7), KTOE (AM 1420) and KXAC (FM 100.5). Maverick men's hockey is carried on KTOE with award-winning sports broadcaster **Mike Sullivan** handling the play-by-play duties.

A longtime veteran of sports play-by-play commentary, Sullivan spent 18 years at KATE radio in Albert Lea, Minn., as sports director and announcer prior to joining KTOE/KDOG. While in Albert Lea Sullivan provided play-by-play coverage for Northwestern College football and basketball, Austin Mavericks junior Ahockey, Southern Minny Stars baseball, the Drake Relays, 17 years of state high school basketball tourna-

ments, ten years of the state boys hockey and basketball tournaments and 20 years of Big Nine Conference high school sports.

Besides his current duties of providing MSU hockey and football play-by-play coverage, Sullivan, 52, also hosts a morning show on Oldies 105 (KXAC FM 100.5).



Selected to guide the Minnesota State men's hockey program in the summer of 2000, Troy Jutting is recognized as one of the top young college coaches in the nation.

The recipient of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association's Coach of the Year award following the 2002-03 season, Jutting also garnered USA Hockey's 2003 National Coach of the Year award after piloting the country's entry to the gold medal at the Under-18 Junior World Cup.

When Jutting was named head coach of the Mavericks prior to the start of the 2000-01 season, he was somewhat of an unproven commodity. A fine college player, Jutting had served as an assistant coach at MSU for ten years prior to being selected as the third head coach in the history of the program. But head coaching experience at any level was one thing not on Jutting's resume at the time.

Seven years later, any lingering doubts about Jutting's ability have been laid to rest. During the course of the past seven campaigns, the

Richfield, Minn., native has led the Mavericks to respectability while competing in arguably the toughest NCAA Division I men's hockey league in the nation.

Named head coach of the Mavericks in March of 2000, he led his squad to a winning record in his first year, with the Mavericks sporting a 19-18-11 mark for the 2000-01 campaign. The Mavericks then went 16-20-2 and finished sixth in the WCHA with an 11-15-2 mark in 2001-02. Ultimately Jutting's sophomore coaching year served as a precursor for an extremely successful 2002-03 campaign. The Mavericks owned a 20-11-10 record, put together a school-record 17-game unbeaten streak, earned a second-place finish in the WCHA standings, earned

a first-round WCHA home playoff berth, claimed a pair of first-round playoff victories and gained MSU's first-ever bid to the NCAA Division I national tournament. MSU hit the 20-win mark for the 12th time in the program's history in 2003-04 and two players (forwards Grant Stevenson and Shane Joseph) were not only First Team All-WCHA, but also Jofa All-Americans. Additionally, nine members of the team earned

Academic All-WCHA honors. In recognition of his work, Jutting was named the 2002-03 WCHA Coach of the Year. The next four years will be characterized as part of the rebuilding phase that all programs go through, but with several strong recruiting classes in the bank, there is no doubt that Jutting and his staff have brought the program to a higher level throughout his tenure.

Stability, wins, postseason appearances, strong recruiting classes and a national profile are program hallmarks and Jutting, along with assistant coaches **Eric Means** and **Darren Blue**, have laid the foundation for continued success.

Since arriving on campus in 1982, Jutting's name has become synonymous with Minnesota State University Hockey. Jutting initially made his mark with the Mavericks as a player and since then has worked his way up the ranks as a graduate assistant coach, a full-time assistant coach, and in the last six years, as MSU's head coach. All told, Jutting's association with the Maverick Hockey program stems 20+ years (four as a player, ten as an assistant coach and seven years as a head coach) and includes 12 winning seasons.

Jutting has played a role in the program's ascension from the NCAA Division II ranks to Division I and membership in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. The Mavericks went 21-14-4 in 1999-2000, finished fourth in the WCHA regular season standings with a 15-10-3 mark and following a first-round series win over Alaska-Anchorage, gained its first-ever berth in the WCHA Final Five.

The personable head coach, who has worked at numerous hockey camps throughout the country, has also been involved with USA Hockey, most recently serving as the head coach with the USA National Under-18 Team that travelled to the Czech Republic and Slovakia in the summer of 2003. With Jutting at the helm, the American squad claimed its first-ever championship at the Under-18 Junior World Cup and he was named USA Hockey's 2003 National Coach of the Year.

A 1987 graduate of MSU, Jutting played four seasons for the Mavericks (1982-86) and finished his career with 145 points in 136 games. He still ranks among the school's all-time leaders in career games played, goals, assists, points and single-season goals. In 1985-86, Jutting's senior year, he finished sixth in the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association scoring race while earning all-conference honors. His efforts helped lead the Mavericks to the NCAA Division III Final Four, MSU also advanced to the NCAA tournament two other times during his career (1983 and 1985).

The 43-year old is one of three brothers to have played hockey for the Mavericks. He owns an undergraduate degree in business from MSU and earned a master's degree in sports administration from MSU in 1996.

Jutting and his wife, Carol Ann, have two sons, Ryan and Tyler.

Pederson, a former high school football and hockey stand-out at Worthington High School, lives in North Mankato with his wife, Kris, and daughters Aubree and Marin.



Maverick Hockey Notes



Generally Speaking.....The Mavericks are entering their ninth season as members of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Not including 22 games of league post-season action in which MSU owns a 7-16-0 mark, the Mavericks sport a 90-105-29 (.467) mark against league opposition since entering the league in 1999-00.

MSU All-Time.....The MSU men's hockey program got its start in 1969 and in the past 36 years has forged a 660-478-113 (.573) record in 1,251 games.

The Song Remains the Same...Minnesota State is playing in the same facility it has since midway through the 1995 season, but the facility has a new name. The building called Midwest Wireless Civic Center now goes by Alltel Center.

The Mavericks are in the House...MSU went 7-8-3 record in games played at Alltel Center (formerly known as Midwest Wireless Civic Center) in 2006-07. MSU's record in 13 seasons in the facility stands at 115-73-32 (.595).

The Mavericks drew a total of 68,454 fans in 18 home games in 2006-07 for an average of 3,803 per contest. The Mavericks ranked 21st amongst all NCAA Division I men's hockey teams in the country in attendance in 1006-07.

And Those Who Shall Lead...Head coach Troy Jutting enters his eighth season at the MSU men's hockey helm with a career record of 108-129-34. Including his time as a player (four years) and as an assistant coach (ten years), the Richfield, Minn., native is in his 22nd season in Mankato. Assistant coaches Eric Means and Darren Blue are entering their 13th and eighth seasons as members of the MSU men's hockey coaching staff.

Looking Back With 20-20 Vision: Minnesota State completed the 2006-07 campaign with an overall record of 13-19-6. The Mavericks, who lost two games to the University of North Dakota in the first round of the WCHA play-offs, finished eighth in the final regular season standings with 10-13-5 record. After starting 3-11-3 in the first 17 games of the year, the Mavericks went 10-8-3 in the remaining 21 games of the season.

Of Blades & Books.....MSU players garnering 2006-07 WCHA All-Academic recognition were Chad Brownlee (Sr., D, Kelowna, B.C.); Chris Clark (Sr., G, San Mateo, Cal.); Lucas Fransen (Sr., D, Langley, B.C.); Joel Hanson (Jr., F, Elk River, Minn.); Kurtis Kisio (Sr., F, Calgary, Alta.); R.J. Linder (Jr., D, St. Cloud, Minn.); Travis Morin (Sr., F, Brooklyn Park, Minn.); Dan Tormey (So., G, Syracuse, N.Y.); Matt Tyree (Jr., F, Spooner, Wis.) and Steve Wagner (Jr., D, Grand Rapids, Minn.). of his team's minutes during the course of the season to be eligible). MSU has totalled 67 WCHA All-Academic selections since joining the league in 1999-00.

Reaping What You Sow.....Award winners at MSU's postseason awards banquet included: Travis Morin (MVP, BW3 Three-Star of the Year), Chad Brownlee (Leadership), Trevor

Bruess (Hardest Worker), **James Gaulrapp** (Most Improved) and **Joel Hanson** (Unsung).

All-in-All: Senior forward Travis Morin, who led MSU in 2006-07 in points (39) and shots (152 - the next closest MSU player was Jon Kalinski with 93) and tied for the team lead with 17 goals, was named All-WCHA Second Team. Morin completed his career ranking third at MSU in DI-era scoring with 58-74—133 in 151 career games. The Brooklyn Park, Minn., native ranks second on MSU's career games played list with 151 games and his 133 points ranks 18th all-time. A team captain as a senior, Morin was named WCHA Offensive Player of the Week twice during his four-year MSU career (once in 2004-05 and once in 2006-07) and finished his senior season by playing in 81 consecutive games. Morin signed a pro contract with Washington following the conclusion of the season.

Pick-adilly....Two members of this year's MSU roster have been selected in the National Hockey League amateur draft. Junior forward Jon Kalinski was selected by Philadelphia in the sixth round (152nd overall) of the 2007 draft. Freshman forward Andy Sackrison was taken by St. Louis in the fifth round, 124th overall, in 2006. Since the inception of the program in 1969-70, ten current or former MSU players have been selected by NHL teams.

It's a Numbers Game.... MSU has only been shut out four times in the last 133 games....Notable numbers from the 2005-06 season: MSU had four players who saw action in all 38

games - Travis Morin, Steve Wagner, Joel Hanson and Jerad Stewart. MSU was 7-0-1 when leading after two periods of play in 2006-07 and has gone 21-0-1 when leading after two periods of play the last two seasons. MSU ranked 38th in the nation in penalty killing with an 81.5 (198/243) mark. The Mavericks were 23rd in power play with an 18.2 (38/209) mark. MSU was 11th in the country in combined special teams with a 52.2 (236/452) ledger.

Offensively Speaking... With 15-13--18 last season, senior forward Joel Hanson is MSU's top-returning scorer. Junior forward Jon Kalinski (17-10--27) enjoyed a break-out season and tallied 13 more goals last year than he did the year before. Junior forward Mick Berge (12-7--19) finished fifth on the team's scoring charts despite missing eight games due to injuries. Sophomore forwards Kael Mouillierat (8-7--15), Jerad Stewart (5-8--13), Zach Harrison (3-9--12), Geoff Irwin (3-8--11) and James Gaulrapp (4-5--9) and sophomore defenseman Nick Canzanello (1-7--8) made contributions in their first seasons with the Mavericks last year.

Defensively Speaking.... The MSU blueline corps lost two key veterans with the departure of senior **Chad Brownlee** (0-4-4), who graduated and junior **Steve Wagner** (6-23--29, 2006-07 All-WCHA Third Team), who signed a free agent deal with the St. Louis Blues, but four experienced players return. Senior **R.J. Linder** (1-3--4) and juniors **Brian Kilburg** (0-6--6) and **Blake Friesen** (1-5--6) join the aforementioned sophomore **Nick Canzanello** (1-7--8).

"Glove Save and a Beauty"... The Maverick goaltending unit will be expected to be a key ingredient in the program's success this year. Juniors Mike Zacharias (10-9-6, .892, 3.07), and Dan Tormey (3-8-0, .869, 3.90) have seen action in 76 games between them the past two seasons. Tormey, a member of the WCHA All-Rookie Team in 2005-06, suffered a wrist injury in a game versus Minnesota early in December and Zacharias played in 14 consecutive games to establish himself as a legitimate #1 netminder in the league. With Tormey fully recovered by the end of the 2006-07 season, MSU enters the 2007-08 campaign with depth between the pipes.

"So I got that going for me...which is nice": Newcomers to this year's roster include defenseman Channing Boe (Green Bay/USHL), defenseman Kurt Davis (Green Bay/USHL), forward Rylan Galiardi (Alexanderia/NAHL), defenseman Peter Lompado (Shattuck-St. Mary's/prep), goaltender Austin Lee (Fargo-Moorhead/NAHL), forward Mike Louwerse (Blake/USHS), forward Brett Peterson (Indiana/USHL), forward Andy Sackrison (Tri City/USHL) and defenseman Ben Youds (Shattuck-St. Mary's/prep).

MSU Hockey Season Outlook

Minnesota State hopes to carry the momentum it gained during the course of the second half of last year into the 2007-08 season. The youthful Mavericks, who finished 2006-07 with a 13-19-6 overall record, went 10-8-3 in the last 21 games of the year giving rise to optimism for 2007-08.

"Going in to last year we were going to be extremely young with seven freshman forwards, so it definitely was going to be a work in prog-

man forwards, so it definitely Seniorforward Joel Han was going to be points in 2006-07. Hans a work in progress," said head coach Troy Jutting. "I thought we got a lot better throughout the course of the year and we were playing our best hockey by the end of the season."

MSU loses six players from last year's roster, including its leading scorer in *All-Western Collegiate Hockey Association Second Team* forward **Travis Morin**. Other graduates include defensemen **Chad Brownlee** and **Lucas Fransen**, along with forward **Kurtis Kisio** and goaltender **Chris Clark**. Grand Rapids, Minn., native **Steve Wagner**, an *All-WCHA Third Team* defenseman as a junior last year, opted to turn profes-

sional and signed a free agent contract with St. Louis. The Mavericks, however return 18 letterwinners including seven of the team's top scorers from last year, four veteran defensemen and two junior goaltenders.

"Obviously with Travis graduating, we lose a lot in scoring," said Jutting, who is entering his eighth year at the MSU men's hockey helm. "We'll have to replace that and any time your seniors move on you have to replace leadership and that is something we're going to have find a way to pick up. But at the same time I'm excited for this year. Having the youngsters from

last year back with a year of experience is going to help the program tremendously with the amount of time they received as freshman. As sophomores, they're probably further along than that. We'll still only have three seniors on this year's team, so we're still young, but we'll have a better chance for success."

Senior forward Joel Hanson (15-13--28 in 2006-07) is the team's top returning scorer and finished last season strongly with 3-7—10 in the last eight games of the season. Junior forward **Jon Kalinski** (17-10--27 in 2006-07) is another forward who finished last year on a run. Kalinski, who had four shorthanded goals during the course of the season, racked up 8-7—15 in his last 14 games of the season. Despite missing eight games due to injury last year, junior forward Mick Berge totalled 12-7—19 in 30 games to rank fifth on the team scoring charts. Besides this trio, other returning forwards include sophomores **Kael Mouillierat** (8-7--15), Trevor Bruess (3-11--14), Jerad Stewart (5-8--13), Zach Harrison (3-9--12), Geoff Irwin (3-8-11), James Gaulrapp (4-5--9), **Jason Wiley** (1-3--4), and senior Matt Tyree (1-0--1). Additions to the roster from a forwards standpoint are Rylan Galiardi (Alexandria/NAHL), Mike Louwerse (Blake/USHS), Brett Peterson (Indiana/USHL) and Andy Sackrison (Tri City/USHL).

"I like this group," said Jutting. "We have some key veterans who have all

gotten better as their college careers have progressed. And from Hanson, Kalinski, Berge, Tyree - we'll expect a little bit of everything from them this year. They can score and unquestionably they'll have to provide leadership. We're still very young up front and they're going to have to continue to be an example for our young And guys. with the large group of sophomore for-

wards I think we'll see a dramatic improvement. A year of understanding what our league is all about usually goes a long ways toward confidence and knowing what it takes. They'll continue to improve throughout their careers, but the biggest jump will likely take place from their freshman to sophomore season."

With the departures of Wagner, Brownlee and Fransen the MSU blueline absorbs the biggest turnover, percentage-wise. Senior **R.J. Linder** (1-3--4), juniors **Brian Kilburg** (0-6--6) and **Blake Friesen** (1-5--6) and sophomores **Nick Canzanello** (1-7--8) and **Ryan Gunderson** (0-1--1) are the returnees.

And the additions of newcomers Channing Boe (Green Bay/USHL), Kurt Davis (Green Bay/USHL), Peter Lompado (Shattuck-St. Mary's/prep) and Ben Youds (Shattuck-St. Mary's/prep) give the Mavericks a optimistic outlook in this area.

"R.J. Linder, Brian Kilburg and Blake Friesen will have to be our veteran leaders with this corps," said Jutting. "And in Nick Canzanello, again, you have a young player who saw a lot of action as a freshman last year and showed a lot of offensive promise. Then there's four freshman defensemen who will all play and are expected to contribute quite a bit. In Ben Youds it's possible

we have the most talented incoming defenseman we've had at MSU. Davis and Boe are a bit older and have junior experience and should be able to step in and contribute immediately."

MSU sports two veteran goaltenders in juniors Mike Zacharias (10-9-6, .892, 3.07) and **Dan Tormey** (3-8-0, .869, 3.90). Coming off a year in which he garnered 2005-06 WCHA All-Rookie Team honors Tormey headed into last year tabbed as the program's #1 netminder. But after he suffered an injured wrist in December, Tormey suffered a wrist injury in a game versus Minnesota early in December and Zacharias played in 14 consecutive games to establish himself as a legitimate #1 netminder in the league. So with Zacharias enjoying a breakout sophomore season, Tormey fully recovered by the end of the 2006-07 season and joined by freshman Austin Lee (Fargo-Moorhead/NAHL), MSU enters the 2007-08 campaign with depth between the pipes.

"We're probably as strong in the goaltending department as we've ever been," said Jutting. "It's exciting to have the depth in goaltending that we have. It's the most important position and it's exciting to have a pair of veterans to go along with a highly-rated incoming freshman."

Minnesota State is scheduled to kick-off the 2007-08 season Oct. 19 with a league game at Michigan Tech. In fact, the Mavericks will play its first six games on the road with the first home game at the newly-renamed Alltel Center not taking place until the University of Minnesota visits Nov. 9.

This is the Western Collegiate Hockey Association

With a noteworthy past that spans six decades and marks its 56th season overall in 2007-08, three characteristics that continue to define the Western Collegiate Hockey Association are history, tradition and success.

From the founding days as the Midwest Collegiate Hockey League (MCHL) from 1951-53, to the Western Intercollegiate Hockey League (WIHL) from 1953-58, and ultimately on to the Western Collegiate Hockey Association in 1959, this prestigious athletic conference has developed and maintained a tradition of excellence that truly is second to none.

In fact, no collegiate conference – in any sport – can top the impressive list of national scale accomplishments of the WCHA and its member teams. Since 1951, teams representing the men's WCHA have earned a record 36 NCAA (national) championships, finished as the national runner-up another 27 times, and qualified for a berth in collegiate hockey's national championship round - the NCAA Men's Frozen Four – in 52 of 55 seasons overall. And since it's founding in 1999-2000, teams representing the women's WCHA have now captured eight consecutive national championships in 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006 and 2007!

In addition to its successes in national championship tournament play over the years, the Western Collegiate Hockey Association owns an enviable reputation for producing outstanding coaches and student-athletes, with hundreds upon hundreds of its alumni moving on to successful professional and Olympic playing careers. On top of the more than 200 men's and women's league alumni who have Olympic experience playing for the likes of the U.S., Canada, Italy, Norway, Austria, Germany, Sweden, Finland, and France, conference-member teams and players have also received additional international exposure on a regular basis since 1951. The WCHA has hosted touring teams from the USSR, Canada, Sweden, Czechoslovakia, Latvia, Germany, Italy, Finland, Norway, Switzerland, England and France. The league has also sent men's WCHA All-Star Teams to Europe in both 1998 (Switzerland) and 2000 (Norway) and hopes to make another overseas trip in the future, while the women's WCHA has also regularly put together all-star teams, with the 2005-06 season bringing WCHA All-Star Team games against the U.S. National Team at both Xcel Energy Center and the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center. In 2006-07, the women's WCHA had nine current and seven former players compete at the 2007 IIHF Women's World Championship in Manitoba, with the likes of former and current WCHA stars Carla MacLeod, Caroline Ouellette, and Tessa Bonhomme winning Gold as members of Team Canada.

Just a few of the more than 350 past and present National Hockey Leaguer's who have roots in the WCHA include the likes of legendary goaltenders Tony Esposito, and Glenn 'Chico' Resch, defensemen Keith Magnuson, Lou Nanne and Curt Giles and forwards Lou Angotti, Bill Masterton, Bill 'Red' Hay, Red Berenson, Glenn Anderson, Mark Johnson and Brett Hull.

The current crop of WCHA stars playing in the NHL include the likes of David Backes, Ed Belfour, Matt Carle, Chris Chelios, Dany Heatley, Mark Parrish, Jordan Leopold, Curtis Joseph, Antti Laaksonen, Matt Cullen, Zach Parise, Jason Blake, Tyler Arnason, Andy Sutton, Ryan Malone, Mike Commodore, Tom Preissing, Wade Dubielewicz, Paul Stastny, and Bret Hedican.

WCHA home attendance for men's games reached another new milestone in 2006-07, this time surpassing the 1.6 million mark for the first time time with a record total of 1,606,686 and a per game average attendance of 7,370. The WCHA has now surpassed the one million mark in home attendance 14 straight seasons and 1.5 million for five straight seasons.

Over the last decade, the WCHA has been able to showcase it's exciting brand of hockey to an ever-increasing number of fans, thanks in part to such impressive new facilities as Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks, Colorado Springs World Arena, the Kohl Center in Madison, Magness Arena in Denver, Mariucci Arena and Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud, and Alltel Center in Mankato.

The conference's two annual playoff championships, known as the Red Baron TM WCHA Final Five (men's) and the WCHA Championship (women's), continue to be among the most successful collegiate tournaments of their kind. Held at Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, the WCHA Final Five has drawn in excess of 1,100,000 fans since it's inception in 1987 – including a record 88,900 in 2007. The women's 2008 WCHA Championship, set for next March 8-9 at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center, also continues to grow both in exposure and attendance.








Selected in the 2001 National Hockey League draft by Columbus, forward **Tim Jackman** made his NHL debut Dec. 20, 2003 when Columbus played the Minnesota Wild in St. Paul, Minn.

The Brooklyn Center, Minn., native, who scored 25 goals and had 28 assists for 53 points in 73 games in two seasons with MSU (2000-01 and 2001-02), had been playing with the Blue Jackets' American Hockey League affiliate in Syracuse, N.Y., before getting the call from the Blue Jackets. He became the first former Minnesota State player to play in the NHL when he played against the Wild in St. Paul

Jackman played three years in the Columbus system before being traded to Phoenix. After spending parts of two seasons with the Coyotes in which he saw eight games with the parent club, he was traded to Los Angeles. While a member of the Kings' organization Jackman played in five NHL games. He then signed a free agent contract with the New York Islanders prior to the start of the 2007-08 campaign.

Jackman has totalled one goal and two assists in 32 NHL games during the course of his professional career.



Grant Stevenson Calgary Flames

Forward **Grant Stevenson**, a Spruce Grove, Alta., native, was in his third season with the San Jose Sharks organization when he made his NHL debut in a game against the Calgary Flames Nov. 23, 2005 in Calgary.

Stevenson spent two years with Minnesota State before signing a free agent contract with the Sharks following the 2002-03 collegiate season.

As a sophomore at MSU in 2002-03, Stevenson was named a *Jofa Second Team All-American* and was selected 2002-03 All-Western Collegiate Hockey Association First Team after racking up 27 goals and 36 assists for 63 points. Stevenson helped lead the Mavericks to a second-place finish in the WCHA regular season standings and their first-ever invitation to the NCAA Division I Tournament. Stevenson totalled 35-44--79 in 76 career games with Minnesota State.

Stevenson, the second former Maverick to play in the NHL, played in 47 games with San Jose in 2005-06 and tallied 10-12--22. He spent the 2006-07 season in the American Hockey League before signing a free agent contract with the Calgary Flames prior to the start of the 2007-08 campaign.




David Backes St. Louis Blues

Former Minnesota State forward **David Backes** made his National Hockey League debut Dec. 19, 2006 when he suited up for St. Louis in a game at Pittsburgh.

Backes, who completed his MSU career totaling 46 goals and 73 assists for 119 points in 115 games 2003-06, was called up by the Blues after playing 27 games with their American Hockey League affiliate in Peoria. He tallied 10-13--23 in 49 games with St. Louis in 2006-07.

Named to the 2005-06 RBK Second Team All-America team, Backes missed one game in his three-year collegiate career. A native of Blaine, Minn., Backes tallied a career-high for points with 42 this season. Named 2005-06 All-WCHA Second Team, he was a member of the 2004-05 All-WCHA Third Team and a member of the 2003-04 WCHA All-Rookie Team. The two-time WCHA All-Academic selection totalled 46-73--119 in 115 career games to rank 23rd on MSU's all-time scoring list. He was a two-time team MVP and two-time team scoring champion. Backes, who owned a 4.00 grade point average and is majoring in electrical engineering.

Named First Team Academic All-American in 2005-06, Backes was selected by the Blues in the second round (62nd overall) of the 2003 NHL draft.



Ryan Carter Anaheim Ducks

Called up by Anaheim on May 17th, 2007 during its Western Conference championship series versus Detroit, forward Ryan Carter became the first former Maverick to have his name engraved on the Stanley Cup when the Ducks defeated the Red Wings in the conference championship and then downed Ottawa to lay claim to the Cup. Carter saw action in four games during Anaheim's successful run.

A native of White Bear Lake, Minn., Carter played the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons playing for Minnesota State, completing his two-year stint with the Mavericks with 58 points in 76 games.

Carter ranked third on MSU's scoring charts in 2005-06 as a sophomore with 19 goals and 16 assists for 35 points, amassing career highs for goals, assists and points in the process. His 19 goals ranked second on the team and he ranked third on the team with five power play goals.

He signed a free agent deal with Anaheim in the summer of 2006 and spent the 2006-07 regular season with Portland of the American Hockey League where he registered 16 goals and 20 assists for 36 points in 76 games.

1979 - 80 Hockey Team (inducted in 1992) - After finishing third in the national tournament in 1978 and second in 1979, the 1979-80 hockey team took on the slogan "Going For The Gold" and came back as the NCAA Division II National Champions. To bring home the title, the Mavericks knocked off Elmira College, 5 - 2 and thrashed the defending champion Lowell 8 – 1 and cruised to a 30-9-1 record. The championship team consisted of Grant Boisner, Mike Odenbach, Clark Johnson, Mike Johnson, Mike Weinkauf, Dave Hjermstad, Paul Larson, Steve Loomis, Greg Larson, Paul Mattson, Larry Long, Steve Forliti, John Passolt, Tom Kern, Chuck Wedin, Tom Hedrick, Tom Sanvik, Jim Follmer, Mike Hill, Carey Boldenow, Tim Hamrick, Rick Steblay, John Wilharm, Jeff Krensing, Brooks Adlin, Steve Carroll, Westy Graves and Jon Ahles. The team was coached by Don Brose with the assistance from Wayne Harris. Earning NAIA All- American honors were Carroll (goalie) and Weinkauf (defenseman). Coach Brose was named Division II Coach of the Year. The 1979 - 80 team set a record for most games in a season (40) and most victories in a season (30). This team holds the record in several seasonal categories including most goals (293), most assists (400), most total points (693), most shots on goal (1, 562), most goals per game (7.32).



Tom Anderson (1974-76 (inducted in 2006) --- Spent two seasons with St. Paul Vulcans junior team prior to enrolling in MSU in 1975...Played

from 1975-1977 with

MSU, scoring 63 points in 59 games...Had 10-21--31 in 31 games in 1975-76 and 7-25--32 in 28 games as a senior...Team captain as a senior...MSU built a 34-19-1 record in his two years with the program...St. Paul, Minn., native was named All-American in both years with MSU...Was a draft choice of the National Hockey League's California Golden Seals in 1974 and following college career played professionally in Austria and with the Phoenix Roadrunners of the Central Hockey League.



Bob Boucher (1966-69) (inducted in 1991)

- Played four years on the MSU club hockey team...Was the "key person" in the success of the club program and

played an instrumental role in the program gaining varsity status in 1969-1970... Received MSU Hockey Development Award and Roger Riter Memorial Award as the MSU's Outstanding Physical Education graduate in 1969...Received B.S. Degree in Physical Education from MSU, a Master's from Ohio State (1971), and Ph. D. from Ohio State (1980).



Don Brose (MSU men's hockey coach 1969-2000) (inducted in 2006) --- Amassed 536-335-79 record in 30 years of coaching Minnesota State men's

hockey...Guided MSU men's hockey program from fledgling independent program to NCAA Division III and Division II

affiliation to NCAA Division I membership and membership in Western Collegiate Hockey Association...Led MSU to NCAA Division II title in 1980...Named WCHA Coach of the Year in 1999-2000 after guiding Mavericks to 21-14-1 mark and a fourth-place finish in inaugural year in WCHA...Honored by the American Hockey Coaches Association with the John MacInnes Award in 2004.



Pat Carroll (1981-85) (inducted in 2001)

- Holds school record for single-season points (88 in 1982-83)...Ranks second all-time at MSU in career goals (123)

and career points (224)...Earned Titan All-America honors in 1983-84...Led Mankato State in scoring three consecutive years...At one point held Northern Collegiate Hockey Association records for single-season goals (23) and points (49) set in 1982-83...Led the NCHA in scoring in 49 points...Two-time All-NCHA pick was 1984-85 team MVP.



Steve Carroll (1977-81) (inducted in 1995)

- Four-year letterwinner...Led Mavericks to four NCAA national tournaments where they finished first once (1979-

80), second once (1978-79) and third twice (1977-78 and 1980-81)... Invited to try out with Minnesota North Stars... Two-time All-American (1979-80 & 1980-81)... Two-time Maverick MVP...One of three brothers to play for the Mavericks, the goaltender was a finalist for Hobey Baker Award (1980-81) as top collegiate hockey player in the country... 1979-80 national tournament MVP... Holds MSU records for games played by a goaltender (104), most career victories (82), most career saves



MSU Hockey Hall of Fame

(3,570), most saves in a season (1,090, 1979-80) and most victories in a season (29, 1979-80)...Ranked first on MSU's Male Athletes of the Century list.



Steve Forliti (1977-81) (inducted in 1999) -Four-year letterwinner... Member of 1979-80 national championship team...Two-year team co-captain....Ranks sec-

ond all-time in career assists (136), third in career points (196) and fifth in career goals (83)...Led MSU in scoring in 1979-80... Holds MSU record for most points in a single game (9 vs. UWEC, 1979) and most assists in a game (7 vs. UWEC, 1979).



Tom Kern (1979-83) (inducted in 1998) - MSU's all-time leading goal-scorer (129) and scorer (239 points in 144 games)...Also holds school record for

single-season goals (43 in 1982-83)... Ranks third all-time in career assists (110), career goals per game (.90) and career points per game (1.66)...1982-83 team MVP garnered All-America recognition twice ('81-82 and '82-83) and was finalist for Hobey Baker Award as college hockey player of the year in 1982-83...Hibbing, Minn., native was a two-time All-NCHA pick and was 1982-83 NCHA MVP... Played on four post-season tournament teams including 1979-80 national championship team...Ranked sixth on MSU's Male Athletes of the Century list.



John Passolt (1979-82) (inducted in 2006)



Brad Reeves (Booster, Volunteer Assistant Men's Hockey Coach) (inducted in 2003) --- Served as assistant men's hockey coach

as interim head coach in 1983-84 during which MSU went 16-14-0....Through his three companies (All-American Towing, KOST Ambulance Service and Mankato Answering Service) has been a significant finincial contributor to MSU and the department of Athletics....Member of the Heritage Club, Blue LIne Club, Maverick Athletics Fund Drive.



David Saatzer (1975-79) (inducted in 1992)

- Four-year MSU letterwinner in hockey (1975-79)...Two-time All-American ('78 and '79)...Played in 106

games for MSU...124 career points (34 goals, 90 assists) ranks second among MSU defensemen and 15th overall...Led MSU in scoring as a junior (40 pts. in 03 games) and was named MVP...As co-captain of '78 and '79 teams, led MSU to third and second place finishes, respectively, in the NCAA tournament...Graduated with B.S. Degree in Business in 1979... Played two years for Nova Scotia of the American Hockey League, a farm team of Montreal...Established AHL record for fastest overtime goal (5 seconds) while playing for Nova Scotia.



Bill Techar (1969-73) (inducted in 1985)

- Was one of the "pioneer" hockey players on Coach Don Brose's first intercollegiate team at MSU...Played four sea-

sons and was MSU's top scorer twice... Had 57 goals, 48 assists, and 105 career points in 60 MSU games...The Mavericks had a four-year record of 47-20-5 (.685) in the 1969-73 era of Techar's career... Was team MVP, captain, and NCAA All-American in 1973... Three-year varsity letterwinner in baseball for MSU coach Jean McCarthy.



Mike Weinkauf (1977-81) (inducted in 2003) --- Two-time All-American (1979-80 and 1980-81)....Ranks first amongst all defensemen and 17th overall

on MSU's career scoring list with 125 points...41 career goals also is a school record for goals by a defenseman...Established school single-season record for points by a defenseman when he had 48 as the Mavericks captured the NCAA Division II championship in 1980...Mainstay on teams that never finished lower than third at the national tournament in four years with the team (third in 1978, second in 1979, first in 1980, third in 1981).... Twice selected to NCAA All-Tournament Team...Selected to 1981 East vs. West College All-Star Game.
