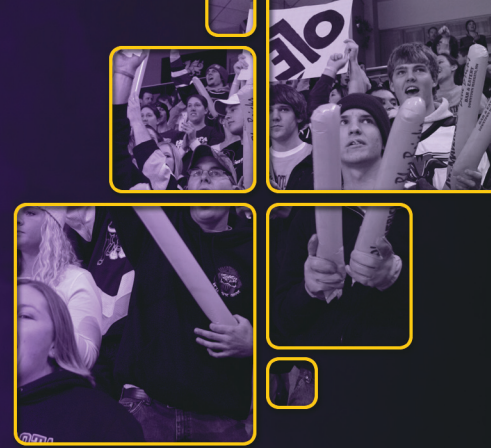

FACTS ABOUT MINNESOTA STATE MEN'S HOCKEY

The Mavericks made their first postseason appearance as members of NCAA Division I when they squared off against #1-ranked Cornell in the 2002-03 Eastern Regional. Currently in its 13th year as members of NCAA Division I, MSU were members of Division II-III from 1969 through 1995 and made 11 NCAA postseason appearances during that time. The Mavericks earned one NCAA Division II title (1979-80), finished second once (1978-79) and two third-place finishes (1977-78 and 1980-81). MSU finished second once in Division III (1990-91), third once (1989-90) and fourth once (1985-86).

There have been several homes to MSU men's hockey since the program was launched in the fall of 1969. In the beginning, the original men's hockey home was the outdoor rink located adjacent to the Valley Physical Education building. MSU also played home games and practiced at the rink in St. Peter (located ten miles north of Mankato) and Faribault (Shattuck-St. Mary's High School), before the Ice Palace opened on the corners of Monks Street and Balcerzak Street in 1974. The Ice Palace, which eventually was renamed All Seasons Arena, served as home ice for the Mavericks from the spring of 1975 until the Midwest Wireless Civic Center was built and opened for business in the spring of 1995. Midwest Wireless Civic Center was renamed Alltel Center in the summer of 2007.

MSU has increased its average home attendance in six of the last seven years and has ranked in the Top Twenty in NCAA Division I national attendance figures in six of the last nine seasons.

Former MSU head coach Don Brose was named the recipient of the John MacInnes Award by the American Hockey Coaches Association in the summer of 2004. Named for the longtime coach at Michigan Tech, this award recognizes those people who have shown a great concern for amateur hockey and youth programs. The recipients have had high winning percentages, as well as outstanding graduation percentages among their former players. The winners of this award have helped young men grow not only as hockey players, but more importantly as men. The colorful Brose coached MSU from 1969 until 2000 and amassed a record of 536-335-79 during that time.

Current MSU men's hockey coach Troy Jutting was a forward on Maverick teams from 1982-86 and served as an assistant coach beginning in 1990 until he was named head coach prior to the start of the 2000 season. Jutting, an all-conference player as a senior, led the Mavericks in power play goals in 1985-86 as MSU earned a berth in the NCAA Division III Final Four. As a head coach, Jutting is a two-time WCHA Coach of the Year. MSU has posted a winning record in 26 of 38 years as a varsity sport.

MSU is in its 13th year as members of NCAA Division I. The Mavericks have forged a record of 198-206-56 (.495) as a Division I program. MSU is entering its tenth season as members of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association and own a 102-117-33 (.470) mark against league opposition since entering the league in 1999-00.

Two men's hockey players made the top ten on the MSU Athletes of the Century list released in 1999. Goaltender Steve Carroll was ranked #1 and forward Tom Kern was ranked #6.

MSU has had three All-Americans since reaffiliating to NCAA Division one. Forwards Grant Stevenson and Shane Joseph accomplished the feat in 2002-03. Both players later signed professional contracts with the San Jose Sharks of the National Hockey League. Forward David Backes was named All American in 2005-06 and signed with St. Louis.

Former forward Jasen Rintala was selected as the recipient of MSU's Best Hustle Award an unprecedented four consecutive seasons (1994-98). Rintala, who owned 29-47--76 numbers in 137 career games, served as MSU's captain as a sophomore, junior and senior.

It's been a quarter of a century since forward Paul Mattson established the school record for goals in a game when he lit the lamp six times in a 13-2 MSU victory over UW-Eau Claire. Forward Steve Forliti also set MSU marks for assists (7) and points (9) in the game.

Former MSU defenseman Jason Krug is MSU's only three-time Academic All-American (for any sport). A native of Terrace, B.C., Krug was named a College Division Second Team Academic All-American as a sophomore

in 1996. He then garnered University Division Second Team Academic All-America honors his junior and senior seasons. Krug tallied 25-61--86 in 129 games from 1994-98.

There have been two scoreless ties in the history of MSU men's hockey. The Mavericks and

Michigan Tech battled to a 0-0 overtime tie in Mankato, Nov. 14, 2003. MSU and St. Cloud State duplicated the feat Jan. 13, 2007 in Mankato.

MSU has had five former players play in the National Hockey League. Forward Tim Jackman accomplished the feat when he debuted with the Columbus Blue Jackets in a game in St. Paul, Minn., Dec. 21, 2003. Forward Grant Stevenson became the second player to make the leap when he debuted with San Jose in 2005-06. Since then

forwards David Backes (with St. Louis in 2006-07) and Ryan Carter (and Anaheim in 2006-07) and defenseman Steve Wagner (St. Louis in 2007-08) have also made the leap.

A total of ten former Mavericks have earned induction into the MSU Athletics Hall of Fame - Bill Techar, Bob Boucher, Dave Saatzer, Steve Carroll, Tom Kern, Steve Forliti, Pat Carroll, Mike Weinkauf, Tom Anderson and John Passolt. The 1979-80 national championship team has also been inducted.

MSU has had defensemen lead the team in scoring on three occasions - John McNamara in 1970-71, Dave Saatzer in 1977-78 and Terry Hughes in 1989-90.

Pressbox: MSU's pressbox is located on the concourse level of Alltel Center. Members of MSU's Athletic Communications staff and print media are seated on the west side of Alltel Center, working members of electronic media are located on the east side.

Credentials: Working press box credentials shall be issued only to accredited newspapers, magazines, radio and television reporters. Please make all requests for credentials in advance by phone or mail to the MSU Athletic Communications Office. Credentials can be mailed or picked up the night of the game at the Alltel Center box office located at the Hickory Street entrance.

Parking: A limited number of parking passes are available for working media and will be issued on a first-come, first-serve basis. Contact MSU Athletic Communications for availability.

Phones: Scores during games can be obtained by calling (507) 389-3000 and asking for the press box. Phone line arrangements at Alltel Center can be made through the MSU Athletic Communications Office.

Interviews: Head coach **Troy Jutting** is available in his office during the week in the morning. After games, he is available in his office at Alltel Center ten minutes after the game's end.

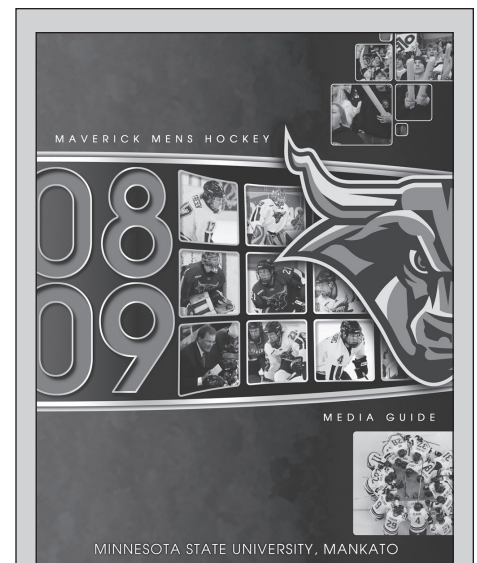

The Mavericks christened Alltel Center Feb. 3, 1995 when they defeated Alabama-Huntsville 6-3 in front of 3,147 fans.

The 1995-96 season marked MSU's first full season at the Center and the Mavericks responded by posting an 11-3-2 home record.

The Mavericks earned an all-time best 15 victories at the Center in 2002-03 and MSU's overall won-loss mark in the facility stands at 126-80-34 (.566).

An integral part of the Mavericks' move to NCAA Division I status, the arena seats 4,704.

In just a short time, Alltel Center has established itself as one of the Midwest's premiere centers for meetings and entertainment.

Alltel Center has hosted nationally televised events, such as the Riders Professional Ladies Figure Skating Championships, Monday Nitro World Championship Wrestling, professional

indoor football, as well as collegiate, international and professional sporting events.

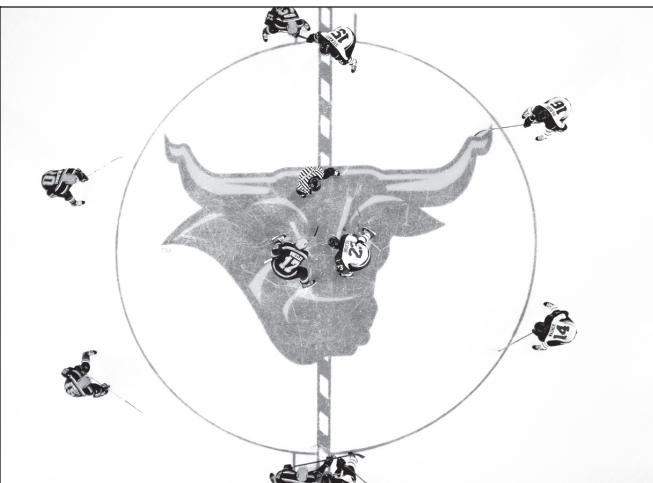
Alltel Center is made up of four components, including a 7,300-seat arena, a reception hall, conference center and a banquet/exhibition hall.

They also feature an in-house advertising agency as well as providing sales, catering and security staffing for all events.

Arena

State-of-the-art acoustics and a superb sound system make the Center arena one of the finest in the country.

With one of the largest floor capacities in Minnesota, the Arena has 7,300 seats available for concerts and has hosted some of the current popular national entertainment acts touring today.

Home Ice Advantage

Alltel Center (formerly known as Midwest Wireless Civic Center) serves as the home facility for the Minnesota State men's hockey program and the Mavericks have used the friendly confines of the downtown facility to their advantage. MSU's all-time mark in the Alltel Center stands at 126-80-34 (.566).

Local hockey fans have shown their appreciation for MSU's success at the Alltel Center by showing up in ever-increasing numbers. The attendance in a game vs. Minnesota (11/09/07) of 5,196 established a single-game MSU record. In two games with the University of North Dakota in 2003, the Mavericks and the Sioux drew crowds of 5,182 and 5,112 in setting a two-game series record of 10,294.

MSU's average attendance has increased six of the last seven seasons with 2007-08's 4,269 per game average representing an all-time high. MSU extended its own streak of top 25 attendance rankings to nine consecutive years after averaging 4,269 fans in 20 home contests to rank 16th in NCAA Division I last year. The average attendance established an all-time single-season high for the Mavericks.

All Seasons Arena & The Don Brose Hockey Center



Opened in 1974, All Seasons Arena has served as the home of Minnesota State Hockey for more than 25 years.

With the completion of the MSU Hockey Complex addition (renamed The Don Brose Hockey Center in Oct. of 2000) to All Seasons Arena in the summer of 1999, the Mavericks can claim practice and administrative facilities second-to-none.

The facility is named after the former coach of MSU's men's hockey program, **Don Brose**. Brose, who led the Mavericks to a NCAA Division II title in 1980, completed his 30-year coaching career following the 1999-2000 season owning a 536-335-79 record.

Constructed to accommodate MSU's men's and women's hockey programs, All Seasons Arena features several amenities in making it one of the top college hockey administrative facilities in the nation.

With two different-sized ice sheets - one regulation and one Olympic, ASA gives the Mavericks unique flexibility.

The two-story 96,000-square foot Don Brose Hockey Center, completed in August of 1999, boasts student study center/lounge area equipped with computers, video equipment and a big screen television.

The complex also includes a reception area, athletic training room, equipment room, men's and women's hockey coaches offices, weight room and locker room areas.

The Radio Voice of MSU Men's Hockey

The 2008-09 season marks the ninth year of a broadcast partnership between MSU Athletics and Radio Mankato. The relationship calls for Radiio Mankato to air Maverick football, men's hockey and men's basketball.

Head Coach Troy Jutting



Selected to guide the Minnesota State men's hockey program in the summer of 2000, **Troy Jutting** is recognized as one of the top college coaches in the nation.

A two-time recipient of the *Western Collegiate Hockey Association's Coach of the Year* award (2002-03 and 2007-08), Jutting also garnered *USA Hockey's 2003 National Coach of the Year* award after piloting the country's entry to the gold medal at the Under-18 Junior World Cup.

When Jutting was named head coach of the Mavericks prior to the start of the 2000-01 season, he was somewhat of an unproven commodity. A fine college player, Jutting had served as an assistant coach at MSU for ten years prior to being selected as the third head coach in the history of the program. But head coaching experience at any level was one thing not on Jutting's resume at the time.

Eight years later, any lingering doubts about Jutting's ability have been laid to rest. During the course of the

past eight campaigns, the Richfield, Minn., native has led the Mavericks to respectability while competing in arguably the toughest NCAA Division I men's hockey league in the nation.

Named head coach of the Mavericks in March of 2000, he led his squad to a winning record in his first year, with the Mavericks sporting a 19-18-11 mark for the 2000-01 campaign. The Mavericks then went 16-20-2 and finished sixth in the WCHA with an 11-15-2 mark in 2001-02. Ultimately Jutting's sophomore coaching year served as a precursor for an extremely successful 2002-03 campaign. The Mavericks owned a 20-11-10 record, put together a

school-record 17-game unbeaten streak, earned a second-place finish in the WCHA standings, earned a first-round WCHA home playoff berth, claimed a pair of first-round playoff victories and gained MSU's first-ever bid to the NCAA Division I national tournament. MSU hit the 20-win mark for the 12th time in the program's history in 2003-04 and two players (forwards **Grant Stevenson**

and **Shane Joseph**) were not only *First Team All-WCHA*, but also *Jofa All-Americans*. In recognition of his work, Jutting was named the 2002-03 *WCHA Coach of the Year*. The next four years will be characterized as part of the rebuilding phase that all programs go through, and in 2007-08 Jutting was again named *WCHA Coach of the Year* and was a finalist for the *Spencer Penrose Award* (nation's top coach) after the Mavericks posted a 19-16-4 mark and went 12-12-4 in league play to finish fourth in the regular-season standings.

Stability, wins, postseason appearances, strong recruiting classes and a national profile are program hallmarks and Jutting, along with assistant coaches **Eric Means** and **Darren Blue**, have laid the foundation for continued success.

Since arriving on campus in 1982, Jutting's name has become synonymous with Minnesota State University Hockey. Jutting initially made his mark with the Mavericks as a player and since then has worked his way up the ranks as a graduate assistant coach, a full-time assistant coach, and in the last eight years, as MSU's head coach. All told, Jutting's association with the Maverick Hockey program stems 20+ years (four as a player, ten as an assistant coach and eight years as a head coach) and includes 14 winning seasons.

Jutting has played a role in the program's ascension from the NCAA Division II ranks to Division I and membership in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. The Mavericks went 21-14-4 in 1999-2000, finished fourth in the WCHA regular season

standings with a 15-10-3 mark and following a first-round series win over Alaska-Anchorage, gained its first-ever berth in the WCHA Final Five.

The personable head coach, who has worked at numerous hockey camps throughout the country, has also been involved with USA Hockey, most recently serving as the head coach with the USA National Under-18 Team that travelled to the Czech Republic and Slovakia in the summer of 2003. With Jutting at the helm, the American squad claimed its first-ever championship at the Under-18 Junior World Cup and he was named *USA Hockey's 2003 National Coach of the Year*.

A 1987 graduate of MSU, Jutting played four seasons for the Mavericks (1982-86) and finished his career with 145 points in 136 games. He still ranks among the school's all-time leaders in career games played, goals, assists, points and single-season goals. In 1985-86, Jutting's senior year, he finished sixth in the Northern Collegiate Hockey Association scoring race while earning all-conference honors. His efforts helped lead the Mavericks to the NCAA Division III Final Four. MSU also advanced to the NCAA tournament two other times during his career (1983 and 1985).

The 44-year old is one of three brothers to have played hockey for the Mavericks. He earned an undergraduate degree in business from Minnesota State and earned a master's degree in sports administration from MSU in 1996.

Jutting and his wife, Carol Ann, have two sons, Ryan and Tyler.

Maverick Hockey Notes



Generally Speaking....The Mavericks are entering their tenth season as members of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. Not including 26 games of league post-season action in which MSU owns an 8-18-0 mark, the Mavericks sport a 102-117-33 (.470) mark against league opposition since entering the league in 1999-00.

MSU All-Time.....The MSU men's hockey program got its start in 1969 and in the past 39 years has forged a 679-494-117 (.572) record in 1,290 games.

Playing With House Money....MSU went 11-7-2 in games played at Alltel Center in 2007-08. MSU's record in 14 seasons in the facility stands at 126-80-34 (.596).

In 2007-08 the Mavericks established all-time highs for single-game attendance (5,196 vs. Minnesota Nov. 10, 2007), total home attendance (85,388) and average home attendance (4,233). MSU ranked 17th amongst all NCAA Division I men's hockey teams in the country in attendance in 2007-08.

In the Lead...A finalist for the 2007-08 *Spencer Penrose Award* as the top coach in the nation, head coach **Troy Jutting** enters his ninth season at the MSU men's hockey helm with a career record of 127-145-38 (.471). Including his time as a player (four years) and as an assistant coach (ten years), the Richfield, Minn., native is in his 23rd season in Mankato. Jutting is a two-time WCHA Coach of the Year (2002-03 and 2007-08). Assistant coaches **Eric Means** and **Darren Blue** are entering their 14th and ninth seasons as members of the MSU men's hockey coaching staff, respectively.

El Capitan: Senior forward **Mick Berge** will be in his first year as team captain for the Mavericks in 2008-09. Senior defenseman **Blake Friesen** and junior forward **Trevor Bruess** are this year's assistant captains.

Looking Back With 20-20 Vision: After beginning the year 3-6-1, the Mavericks went 16-10-3 in the remaining 29 games to complete the 2007-08 season with a won-loss record of 19-16-4. The 19 wins was the most by a MSU team since 2002-03 when the Mavericks went 20-11-10. The Mavericks finished in fourth place in the 2007-08 WCHA regular-season standings with a record of 12-12-4. The fourth-place finish marked the third time in its nine seasons in the ten-team league that MSU had achieved a top-five finish.

Academia.....MSU players garnering *WCHA All-Academic* recognition in 2007-08 were **Nick Canzanello** (So., Defenseman, Rochester, Minn.); **Joel Hanson** (Sr., Forward, Elk River, Minn.), three-time); **R.J. Linder** (Sr., Defenseman, St. Cloud, Minn., three-time); **Dan Tormey** (Jr., Goaltender, Syracuse, N.Y., two-time); **Matt Tyree** (Sr., Forward, Spooner, Wis., two-time) and

Jason Wiley (So., Forward, Bloomington, Minn.). In eight seasons with the Mavericks, head coach Troy Jutting has had 79 players receive WCHA All-Academic honors.

And the Winners Were.....Award winners at MSU's post-season awards banquet included: **Mike Zacharias** (MVP), **Jason Wiley** (Most Improved), **R.J. Linder** (Unsung Hero Award and Don Brose Leadership Award), **Trevor Bruess** (Hardest Worker) and **Mick Berge** (Buffalo Wild Wings Three-Star Award).

Ranging: The youngest player on this year's roster is freshman forward **Justin Jokinen** (born Nov. 25, 1989). The oldest Maverick is senior defenseman **Brian Kilburg** (born May 10, 1984).

Natural Selection....Two members of this year's MSU roster have been selected in the National Hockey League amateur draft. Sophomore forward **Andy Sackrison** was taken by St. Louis in the fifth round, 124th overall, in 2006. Freshman forward **Justin Jokinen** was picked by Buffalo in the fourth round, 101st overall, in 2008. Since the inception of the program in 1969-70, 11 current or former MSU players have been selected by NHL teams.

Consecutive Order: Senior forward **Mick Berge** has played in 56 consecutive games and with 99 career games played will become the 96th Maverick to play in at least 100 career games. Junior forwards **Kael Mouillierat** (65 consecutive games) and **Zach Harrison** (57 consecutive games) also head into the season with healthy consecutive games played streaks in tact.

In the Event You Failed to Notice... MSU has only been shut out six times in the last 172 games.... Notable numbers from the 2007-08 season: MSU had five players who saw action in all 39 games - **Jon Kalinski**, **Mick Berge**, **Zach Harrison**, **Joel Hanson** and **Kael Mouillierat**...Of the 16 skaters on the 2007-08 roster who were also on the 2006-07 Minnesota State roster, nine increased their point totals from the 2006-07 season. Sophomore forward **Trevor Bruess**, who had 16 more points than he had during his freshman campaign (14 points in 2006-07, 30 points in 2007-08), exhibited the biggest jump in production. Sophomore forward **Jason Wiley** went from four points as a freshman to 18 points in 2007-08 for a 14-point increase.

On a National Level: **Mick Berge** ranked 25th in the nation in 2007-08 with .51 goals per game (20 in 39 games)...**Trevor Bruess** tied for 74th in assists per game (21 assists in 38 games for a .55 apg mark) and had three shorthanded goals to tie for tenth in the country in shorties per game... Goaltender **Mike Zacharias** was ninth in goals against average (.2.08), 12th in save percentage (.924) and 21st in winning percentage (.571).

Offensively Speaking... MSU returns six of its top seven scorers in junior forward **Trevor Bruess** (9-21--3), senior forward **Mick Berge** (20-6--26), junior forward **Kael Mouillierat** (11-11--22), junior forward **Geoff Irwin** (9-12--21), sophomore forward **Andrew Sackrison** (6-14--20), junior forward **Zach Harrison** (6-13--19) and junior forward **Jason Wiley** (11-7--18). MSU ranked 32nd in the country in scoring in 2007-08 with 2.72 goals per game. The Mavericks were 47th in the nation in power play with a 13.3% (23/173) mark.

Defensively Speaking....Graduated **R.J. Linder** is the lone departee from last year's defensive corps. Returnees include seniors **Brian Kilburg** (3-8--11, +7) and **Blake Friesen** (1-3--4, +5), junior **Nick Canzanello** (1-10--11, +5) and sophomores **Ben Youds** (1-11--12, +8), **Kurt Davis** (1-14--15, +3) and **Channing Boe** (0-3--3, +1). Newcomers along the blue line are a pair of freshmen from the United States Hockey League in **Cameron Cooper** (Tri-City) and **Baylor Dieter** (Green Bay).

"In the Crease"... After a stellar season in which he saw action in 36 games and backstopped the Mavericks to a fourth-place WCHA regular-season finish, senior **Mike Zacharias** (18-13-4, .924, 2.08) enters 2008-09 as one of the top goaltenders in the country. Named MSU's 2007-08 *MVP* and a two-time *WCHA Defensive Player of the Week* last year, Zacharias concluded the year with 29 consecutive starts. MSU is fortunate to have two experienced goaltenders with senior **Dan Tormey** (1-3-0, .839, .499 in 2007-08) having seen action in 50 games during the course of the last three seasons. Freshman **Austin Lee** redshirted with the Mavericks in 2007-08.

Q & A With Head Coach Troy Jutting

Your thoughts on last season - one in which your team finished fourth in the WCHA and hosted Minnesota in an epic first-round league play-off series.

TJ: "I felt we progressed as the year went along and we were playing our best hockey at the end of the season. We had a young team and most of those kids are back. The series with Minnesota, while disappointing because we didn't come out on top, is going to make us a better team this upcoming season."

Where do you think the Mavericks will be placed in the preseason league poll and who do you foresee as being the favorites in the WCHA heading into the season?

TJ: "I don't know where we're going to be selected. I think we were picked eighth or ninth last year and finished fourth, so you wonder how much stock you should put into it. I think Denver will be strong, most of their kids are back and they had a very good team last year. The Wisconsin, the Minnesotas, you expect them to be strong every year and the league, as always, will be strong top to bottom like it's been. You need to worry about getting better during the course of the season and you'll end up where you need to be at the end."

Any particular goals you have identified for 2008-09?

TJ: "Not really. Our goals are the same as they are every year...to get better every day. I think if you do that, you should be in good shape by the end of year. We do expect to have a good team this season."

Goaltender Mike Zacharias enjoyed a stellar year as a junior. How important was his play in the success the Mavericks experienced last season? Where does he rank in terms of the elite goaltenders in the WCHA and NCAA Division I

hockey as he enters his senior campaign?

TJ: "Mike had a great year last season and played a big role in our success. And we're going to need Mike, and Dan Tormey, who is a very good goaltender in his own right, we're going to need both of those goaltenders to have strong years for us if we expect to be successful. If you're going to have a good team, you have to have great goaltending."

Mick Berge tallied a team-high 20 goals last year. He's also been named captain heading into his senior season. What are your expectations for the Oklahoma City native in 2008-09?

TJ: "We're going to need Mick to score like he does and we're going to need leadership from him. I think last year he was an assistant captain and did a nice job for us in that role. That experience will help him as captain this year and with three seniors plus the two senior goaltenders, it's going to be important that he's a big-time leader for us. He's ready and we're excited for him."

Trevor Bruess led the Mavericks in scoring as a sophomore and is a two-time recipient of the team's Hardest Worker Award. Your thoughts on the talented two-way forward.

TJ: "It's been fun with Trevor because we've seen him make tremendous strides in his two year's with the program. If he can take another step this season, he'll be one of the better players in the league. He brings alot to the table, he's a big, strong kid. He can really skate, he kills penalties, plays on the power play and does a lot of things for us and is going to play a ton for us this year."

The rest of the returning forwards include Irwin, Mouillierat, Sackrison, Harrison, Wiley, Galiardi and Gaulrapp - a nice mix of offense and grit, speed and experience. How much of a role can they play in your expectations for the Mavericks this year?

TJ: "If we're going to be the team we think we can be, that's the group that's going to have to get us there. Geoff Irwin, Kael Mouillierat, Andy Sackrison, Jason Wiley - those kids have a ton of offensive talent, they're going to have to score and make plays this year if we're going to be successful. This group has played a lot in the past two years in a lot of situations you don't normally get into that early in your careers. Not only are they good hockey players, they're also experienced hockey players now."

R.J. Linder graduated, but everyone else returns amongst the MSU rearguards. How about this group which includes veterans Blake Friesen, Brian Kilburg and Nick Canzanello along with sophomores Kurt Davis, Ben Youds and Channing Boe?



Senior goaltender **Mike Zacharias** was a two-time *WCHA Defensive Player of the Week* in 2007-08 and ranked 12th in the country in save percentage and ninth in goals against average.

TJ: "I'm excited about our defensive corps. I think it's the best defensive group we've ever had here. I really like the young kids, they did a great job last year as freshmen - all three of them. The veterans have been around and they understand the game. I think Blake Friesen is one player that took a huge step last year with his play. They can lead by example."

Joining redshirted forwards Brett Peterson and Mike Louwerse and redshirted goaltender Austin Lee, new faces on the roster include

four forwards (Jokinen, Mueller, Schiller and Thompson) and two defensemen (Cooper and Dieter). What do you make of this class of freshmen?

TJ: "I really like this group of kids. When you add the redshirts, it gives us some competition for positions on the roster. This a talented group with skill and offense, just great additions to our program. The two freshmen defensemen - a pair of 20-year olds with two years of experience in the United States Hockey League.

With a noteworthy past that spans six decades and marks its 56th season overall in 2007-08, three characteristics that continue to define the Western Collegiate Hockey Association are history, tradition and success.

The league has also sent men's WCHA All-Star Teams to Europe in both 1998 (Switzerland) and 2000 (Norway) and hopes to make another overseas trip in the future, while the women's WCHA has also regularly put together all-star teams, with the 2005-06 season bringing WCHA All-Star Team games against the U.S. National Team at both Xcel Energy Center and the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center. In 2006-07, the women's WCHA had nine current and seven former players compete at the 2007 IIHF Women's World Championship in Manitoba, with the likes of former and current WCHA stars Carla MacLeod, Caroline Ouellette, and Tessa Bonhomme winning Gold as members of Team Canada.

Just a few of the more than 350 past and present National Hockey League's who have roots in the WCHA include the likes of legendary goaltenders **Tony Esposito**, and **Glenn 'Chico' Resch**, defensemen **Keith Magnuson**, **Lou Nanne** and **Curt Giles** and forwards **Lou Angotti**, **Bill Masterton**, **Bill 'Red' Hay**, **Red Berenson**, **Glenn Anderson**, **Mark Johnson** and **Brett Hull**.

The current crop of WCHA stars playing in the NHL include the likes of **David Backes**, **Ed Belfour**, **Matt Carle**, **Chris Chelios**, **Dany Heatley**, **Mark Parrish**, **Jordan Leopold**, **Curtis Joseph**, **Antti Laaksonen**, **Matt Cullen**, **Zach Parise**, **Jason Blake**, **Tyler Arnason**, **Andy Sutton**, **Ryan Malone**, **Mike Commodore**, **Tom Preissing**, **Wade Dubielewicz**, **Paul Stastny**, and **Bret Hedican**.

WCHA home attendance for men's games reached another new milestone in 2006-07, this time surpassing the 1.6 million mark for the first time time with a record total of 1,606,686 and a per game average attendance of 7,370. The WCHA has now surpassed the one million mark in home attendance 14 straight seasons and 1.5 million for five straight seasons.

Over the last decade, the WCHA has been able to showcase it's exciting brand of hockey to an ever-increasing number of fans, thanks in part to such impressive new facilities as Ralph Engelstad Arena in Grand Forks, Colorado Springs World Arena, the Kohl Center in Madison, Magness Arena in Denver, Mariucci Arena and Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud, and Alltel Center in Mankato.

The conference's two annual playoff championships, known as the Red Baron™ WCHA Final Five (men's) and the WCHA Championship (women's), continue to be among the most successful collegiate tournaments of their kind. Held at Xcel Energy Center in St. Paul, the WCHA Final Five has drawn in excess of 1,100,000 fans since it's inception in 1987 – including a record 88,900 in 2007. The women's 2008 WCHA Championship, set for next March 8-9 at the Duluth Entertainment & Convention Center, also continues to grow both in exposure and attendance.



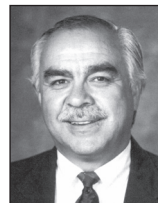

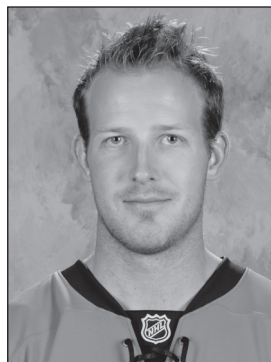
Tim Jackman
New York Islanders

Selected in the 2001 National Hockey League draft by Columbus, forward **Tim Jackman** made his NHL debut Dec. 20, 2003 when Columbus played the Minnesota Wild in St. Paul, Minn.

The Brooklyn Center, Minn., native, who scored 25 goals and had 28 assists for 53 points in 73 games in two seasons with MSU (2000-01 and 2001-02), had been playing with the Blue Jackets' American Hockey League affiliate in Syracuse, N.Y., before getting the call from the Blue Jackets. He became the first former Minnesota State player to play in the NHL when he played against the Wild in St. Paul.

Jackman played three years in the Columbus system before being traded to Phoenix. After spending parts of two seasons with the Coyotes in which he saw eight games with the parent club, he was traded to Los Angeles. While a member of the Kings' organization Jackman played in five NHL games. He then signed a free agent contract with the New York Islanders prior to the start of the 2007-08 campaign.

Jackman, who had a goal and three assists in 36 games with the Islanders last year, has totalled two goals and five assists in 68 NHL games during the course of his professional career.



Grant Stevenson
Atlanta Thrashers

Forward **Grant Stevenson**, a Spruce Grove, Alta., native, was in his third season with the San Jose Sharks organization when he made his NHL debut in a game against the Calgary Flames Nov. 23, 2005 in Calgary.

Stevenson spent two years with Minnesota State before signing a free agent contract with the Sharks following the 2002-03 collegiate season.

As a sophomore at MSU in 2002-03, Stevenson was named a *Jofa Second Team All-American* and was selected *2002-03 All-Western Collegiate Hockey Association First Team* after racking up 27 goals and 36 assists for 63 points. Stevenson helped lead the Mavericks to a second-place finish in the WCHA regular season standings and their first-ever invitation to the NCAA Division I Tournament. Stevenson totalled 35-44--79 in 76 career games with Minnesota State.

Stevenson, the second former Maverick to play in the NHL, played in 47 games with San Jose in 2005-06 and tallied 10-12--22. He spent the 2006-07 season in the American Hockey League before signing a free agent contract with the Calgary Flames prior to the start of the 2007-08 campaign. He led Quad Cities of the American Hockey in scoring in 2007-08 with 30-43--73 and inked a free agent deal with Atlanta for 2008-09.



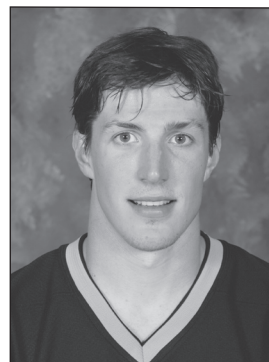
David Backes
St. Louis Blues

Former Minnesota State forward **David Backes** made his National Hockey League debut Dec. 19, 2006 when he suited up for St. Louis in a game at Pittsburgh.

Backes, who completed his MSU career totaling 46 goals and 73 assists for 119 points in 115 games 2003-06, was called up by the Blues after playing 27 games with their American Hockey League affiliate in Peoria. He tallied 10-13--23 in 49 games with St. Louis in 2006-07. He totalled 13-18--31 in his sophomore year with the Blues in 2007-08.

Named to the 2005-06 RBK Second Team All-America team, Backes missed one game in his three-year collegiate career. A native of Blaine, Minn., was named *2005-06 All-WCHA Second Team*, he was a member of the *2004-05 All-WCHA Third Team* and a member of the *2003-04 WCHA All-Rookie Team*. The two-time WCHA All-Academic selection totalled 46-73--119 in 115 career games to rank 23rd on MSU's all-time scoring list. He was a two-time team MVP and two-time team scoring champion. Backes owned a 4.00 grade point average and majored in electrical engineering.

Named *First Team Academic All-American* in 2005-06, Backes was selected by the Blues in the second round (62nd overall) of the 2003 NHL draft.



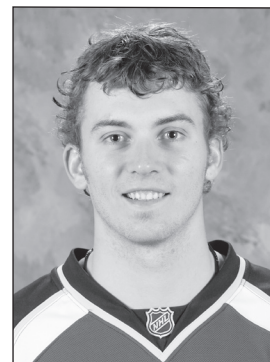
Ryan Carter
Anaheim Ducks

Called up by Anaheim on May 17th, 2007 during its Western Conference championship series versus Detroit, forward **Ryan Carter** became the first former Maverick to have his name engraved on the Stanley Cup when the Ducks defeated the Red Wings in the conference championship and then downed Ottawa to lay claim to the Cup. Carter saw action in four games during Anaheim's successful run.

A native of White Bear Lake, Minn., Carter spent the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons playing for Minnesota State, completing his two-year stint with the Mavericks with 58 points in 76 games.

Carter ranked third on MSU's scoring charts in 2005-06 as a sophomore with 19 goals and 16 assists for 35 points, amassing career highs for goals, assists and points in the process. His 19 goals ranked second on the team and he ranked third on the team with five power play goals.

He signed a free agent deal with Anaheim in the summer of 2006 and spent the 2006-07 regular season with Portland of the American Hockey League where he registered 16 goals and 20 assists for 36 points in 76 games. Carter posted 4-4--8 numbers in 33 regular-season games with the Ducks in 2007-08.



Steve Wagner
St. Louis Blues

Steve Wagner became the first former MSU defenseman to play in the NHL when he debuted with the St. Louis Blues in a game at Toronto Jan. 29, 2008.

Signed by St. Louis as a free agent following his junior season with the Mavericks in the spring of 2007, Wagner played in 23 games with the Blues in 2007-08 and scored five goals to go along with seven assists for 12 points.

Named *All-Western Collegiate Association Third Team* in 2006-07, Wagner led MSU defensemen in scoring in 2006-07 with 6-23--29. He trailed only Travis Morin on the overall MSU offensive charts and totalled career-highs for goals, assists and points. His 29 points in his junior season tied for 12th on MSU's single-season defensemen scoring list. The Grand Rapids, Minn., native led MSU with 23 assists in 2006-07 and in 113 career games racked up 12-43--55. An assistant captain in 2006-07, he was a two-time *WCHA All-Academic* honoree.

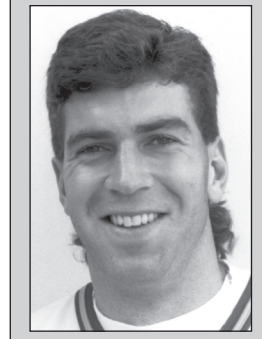

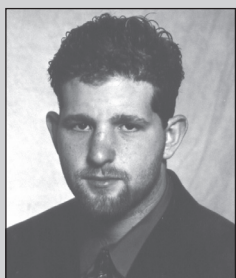

July 17, 1995—Mankato business group presents NCAA Division I proposal to MSU.

Dec. 20, 1995—The board of Minnesota State Colleges and Universities (MnSCU) approves MSU's bid to become an NCAA Division I member.

Mar. 2, 1996—The Mavericks close out 27 years as an NCAAII-III member with a 4-3 home loss to eventual NCAA II national champion Alabama-Huntsville.

Oct. 11, 1996 —MSU kicks off its first season as an independent member of NCAA Division I with an away game at Ferris State. MSU defeats FSU the next night (5-4 in overtime) to record first wins as a member of Division I. The Mavericks go on to record a 17-14-3 won-loss mark for 1996-97.

March 12, 1999—A goal by **Andy Fermoye** in overtime gives the Mavericks a 3-2 win over #1-ranked North Dakota in first round action of the WCHA play-offs. MSU drops the next two games to finish the season with a 18-16-5 mark.

Jan. 22, 2000—Sophomore goaltender **Eric Pateman** stymies top-ranked Wisconsin with 39 saves as Mavericks claim 3-0 home win. Pateman would go on to establish MSU career records

Feb. 26, 2000—A school record and standing-room only crowd of 5,144 watch the Mavericks and second-ranked North Dakota battle to 1-1 overtime draw in the Civic Center.

March 11, 2000—MSU earns 3-2 win to sweep visiting Alaska-Anchorage in first round of WCHA play-offs.

March 16, 2000—Minnesota claims 6-4 Final Five victory to end MSU's season. Mavericks finish '99-00 with 21-14-4 mark. Brose finishes with 536-327-72 all-time mark and ranks seventh on all-time NCAA coaching wins list.

March 27, 2000—Longtime assistant coach and former player **Troy Jutting** is named MSU men's hockey head coach.

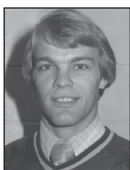

1979 – 80 Hockey Team (inducted in 1992) – After finishing third in the national tournament in 1978 and second in 1979, the 1979–80 hockey team took on the slogan "Going For The Gold" and came back as the NCAA Division II National Champions. To bring home the title, the Mavericks knocked off Elmira College, 5 – 2 and thrashed the defending champion Lowell 8 – 1 and cruised to a 30 – 9 – 1 record. The championship team consisted of Grant Boisner, Mike Odenbach, Clark Johnson, Mike Johnson, Mike Weinkauf, Dave Hjernstad, Paul Larson, Steve Loomis, Greg Larson, Paul Mattson, Larry Long, Steve Forliti, John Passolt, Tom Kern, Chuck Wedin, Tom Hedrick, Tom Sanvik, Jim Follmer, Mike Hill, Carey Boldenow, Tim Hamrick, Rick Steblay, John Wilharm, Jeff Krensing, Brooks Adlin, Steve Carroll, Westy Graves and Jon Ahles. The team was coached by Don Brose with the assistance from Wayne Harris. Earning NAIA All-American honors were Carroll (goalie) and Weinkauf (defenseman). Coach Brose was named Division II Coach of the Year. The 1979 – 80 team set a record for most games in a season (40) and most victories in a season (30). This team holds the record in several seasonal categories including most goals (293), most assists (400), most total points (693), most shots on goal (1, 562), most goals per game (7.32).



Tom Anderson (1974-76 (inducted in 2006) --- Spent two seasons with St. Paul Vulcans junior team prior to enrolling in MSU in 1975...Played from

1975-1977 with MSU, scoring 63 points in 59 games...Had 10-21--31 in 31 games in 1975-76 and 7-25--32 in 28 games as a senior...Team captain as a senior...MSU built a 34-19-1 record in his two years with the program...St. Paul, Minn., native was named All-American in both years with MSU...Was a draft choice of the National Hockey League's California Golden Seals in 1974 and following college career played professionally in Austria and with the Phoenix Roadrunners of the Central Hockey League.



Bob Boucher (1966-69) (inducted in 1991) - Played four years on the MSU club hockey team...Was the "key person" in the success of the club program and played an instrumental

role in the program gaining varsity status in 1969-1970...Received MSU Hockey Development Award and Roger Riter Memorial Award as the MSU's Outstanding Physical Education graduate in 1969...Received B.S. Degree in Physical Education from MSU, a Master's from Ohio State (1971), and Ph. D. from Ohio State (1980).



Don Brose (MSU men's hockey coach 1969-2000) (inducted in 2006) --- Amassed 536-335-79 record in 30 years of coaching Minnesota State men's hockey...Guided MSU

men's hockey program from fledgling independent program to NCAA Division III and Division II affiliation to NCAA Division I membership and membership in Western Collegiate Hockey Association... Led MSU to NCAA Division II title in 1980...Named WCHA Coach of the Year in 1999-2000 after guiding Mavericks to 21-14-1 mark and a fourth-place finish in inaugural year in WCHA...Honored by the American Hockey Coaches Association with the John MacInnes Award in 2004.



Pat Carroll (1981-85) (inducted in 2001) - Holds school record for single-season points (88 in 1982-83)... Ranks second all-time at MSU in career goals (123) and career points

(224)...Earned Titan All-America honors in 1983-84...Led Mankato State in scoring three consecutive years...At one point held Northern Collegiate Hockey Association records for single-season goals (23) and points (49) set in 1982-83...Led the NCHA in scoring in 49 points...Two-time All-NCHA pick was 1984-85 team MVP.



Steve Carroll (1977-81) (inducted in 1995)

- Four-year letterwinner...Led Mavericks to four NCAA national tournaments where they finished first once (1979-80),

second once (1978-79) and third twice (1977-78 and 1980-81)...Invited to try out with Minnesota North Stars...Two-time All-American (1979-80 & 1980-81)... Two-time Maverick MVP...One of three brothers to play for the Mavericks, the goaltender was a finalist for Hobey Baker Award (1980-81) as top collegiate hockey player in the country...1979-80 national tournament MVP...Holds MSU records for games played by a goaltender (104), most career victories (82), most career saves (3,570), most saves in a season (1,090, 1979-80) and most victories in a season (29, 1979-80)...Ranked first on MSU's Male Athletes of the Century list.

- Four-year letterwinner...Member of 1979-80 national championship team...Two-year team co-captain....

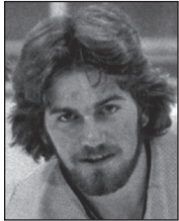

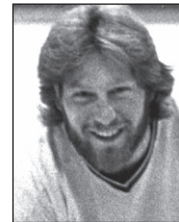
**David Saatzer (1975-79) (inducted in 1992)**

- Four-year MSU letterwinner in hockey (1975-79)...Two-time All-American ('78 and '79)...Played in 106 games for MSU...124 career points (34 goals, 90 assists) ranks second among MSU defensemen and 15th overall...Led MSU in scoring as a junior (40 pts. in 03 games) and was named MVP...As co-captain of '78 and '79 teams, led MSU to third and second place finishes, respectively, in the NCAA tournament...Graduated with B.S. Degree in Business in 1979...Played two years for Nova Scotia of the American Hockey League, a farm team of Montreal...Established AHL record for fastest overtime goal (5 seconds) while playing for Nova Scotia.

**Mike Weinkauff (1977-81) (inducted in 2003)**

--- Two-time All-American (1979-80 and 1980-81)... Ranks first amongst all defensemen and 17th overall on MSU's career scoring list with 125 points...41 career goals also is a school record for goals by a defenseman...Established school single-season record for points by a defenseman when he had 48 as the Mavericks captured the NCAA Division II championship in 1980...Mainstay on teams that never finished lower than third at the national tournament in four years with the team (third in 1978, second in 1979, first in 1980, third in 1981)...Twice selected to NCAA All-Tournament Team... Selected to 1981 East vs. West College All-Star Game.
